Your homework is to talk to your family about your personal family history. Here are some talking points:

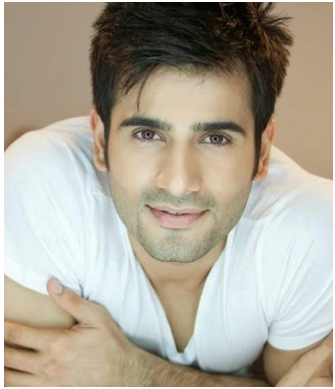

- Aditya is 19 years old. He is from Mumbai, India and dreams of going to California to pursue an acting career. Can he apply for naturalization? Why or why not?



- Beatrice is 68 years old. She is originally from Kumasi, Ghana, but has been in Pennsylvania with a Permanent Residency Card for the past 2 years and 10 months with her daughter and 3 grandchildren. Can she apply for naturalization? Why or why not?



- Mark is 34 years old. He is originally from Puerto La Cruz, Venezuela. He came to the United States 6 years ago with a Permanent Residency Card. Last spring his father was very ill, so Mark returned to Puerto La Cruz to see him before he died. While in Venezuela, shortly after the funeral, Mark was hit by a motorcycle. Although he had intended to only spend a month outside of the US, his recovery was slow and he ended up spending 13 months in Venezuela. Now that he is back in the US, he wants to apply for naturalization. Can he apply for naturalization? Why or why not?

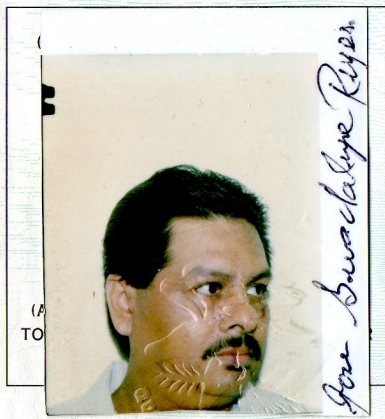
